

## 3 October 2021

#### Dear Families,

I hope this letter at the start of our fifth week finds you and your families well. I have a couple of updates and some news items to go through with you all for clarity and communication.

## Learning Habit 1 - Uniform Update

We are delighted to see so many of our students in full uniform looking very smart. The number of corrections for this are now in single figures which is good to see. Just a few issues around bag sizes that simply won't fit their booklets and knowledge organisers in which are A4 in size. The uniform shop is always open, we have a good stock of bags, shoes, ties and other items for your child to avoid a morning correction. The gate opens at 8:00 and line ups for morning meeting begin at 8:17.

I must draw your attention to the shoe policy, whilst we know that last year students were permitted to wear trainers, in a Dixons Academy however, they must wear a shoe. These rules are not going to change. Examples of those are on the academy website. This is one of our expectations which I am pleased to see 99% of our students meeting. We are happy to provide shoes in any circumstances so that our students can get to 100%. We have just ordered new stock to provide free of charge for our students if they need them. Any students changing into trainers during the school day without authorisation will be issued a correction. The shoes remain on all day (except of course during a PE lesson or a lunchtime session on the MUGA when trainers must be worn).

We are aware of the delay with our Academy PE kit. It is now with retailers and we are waiting for it to be embroidered with our logo. The PE department has communicated to all students what they must wear in the interim. Black, blue or grey t-shirt and shorts or the old Broadgreen Kit. No student arrives to the academy in a PE kit or trainers, they all arrive in uniform and get changed for the lesson.

## **Learning Habit 2- Equipment**

Students need to bring all their equipment in their pencil case every day. We are continuing with our expectations for this from now on. This learning habit is generally straight-forward, we gave all our students a pencil case with everything in it, they just need to continue to bring it daily and replenish any lost or missing items. All items are free of charge in our pupil reception area. The rule is in place to teach them responsibility and personal organisation. It is open from 8am. We will never put a student in a correction who is doing the right thing.

## **Learning Habit 3 - Punctuality**

We will be introducing our learning habit of punctuality soon. Students are expected to arrive on site from 8:00am and in line ups for 8:15. Hands go up at 8:17 for Morning Meeting. More on this to come.

## **Covid Update**

All students are being given a box of lateral flow tests weekly and are encouraged to test at home twice weekly. We do want to keep our school safe and always ask our site team for a deep clean if we are informed of any positive cases. We are monitoring cases and I have spoken with Public Health Liverpool who are satisfied that numbers are falling across the city and the increased ventilation and sanitation measures are sufficient.

The advice in a nutshell is:

Test twice weekly at home

Do not attend school or college if you have coronavirus symptoms – arrange a PCR test

Wear a mask on public transport

Wear a mask in communal areas if you want to (this will become mandatory again if we reach threshold)

Keep up good hygiene habits, including washing hands regularly, sneezing and coughing into a tissue or your elbow

Ask a member of staff to go to the medical room if you feel unwell

No need for self-isolation if fully vaccinated or under 18 years of age

All contacts to take a PCR test whilst continuing to attend school or college as normal

Following a positive case, all contacts will be followed up by NHS Test and Trace

#### **Food Bank**

As part of the 6th Form curriculum, students complete Service Learning. This involves students planning and delivering a project that meets a community need. The Y12 students have decided to continue to support a local food bank Micah Liverpool, which the school has worked with over the last few years. They are asking for small donations from parents or guardians if possible. Y12 students will collect all donation at a drop off point inside Heliers Road entrance starting on Monday 4 October every morning between 8:00 and 8:15. If you send a donation with your child, please ask them to drop it off as they enter the school gates. Items the food bank urgently requires are: long life milk, nappies, tinned baby food, pasta, cereals, sugar and biscuits. Any additional items are also very much appreciated.

#### Yr 11 Reward Trip

We have set a date for a Y11 Reward Trip to Alton Towers during the final Saturday in November (covid restrictions permitting). They felt that during their time at the school they had never had the opportunity to go on a trip with their classmates so we would like to offer them this experience. Criteria will apply: 100% attendance and punctuality (medical appointments are sanctioned with parental contact to school), attendance at masterclasses and no negative behaviour incidents. The trip is of course optional and staff have volunteered their Saturday to safeguard them. More on that to come.
